(Enter CHARLEY running)

CHARLEY I've done it, Jack, I've done it!

JACK. Done what?

CHARLEY I've let the cat out of the bag, and told her everything.

JACK You fool! Why did you --told her what?

CHARLEY That I love her.

JACK Oh, is that all?

CHARLEY Yes, but Jack, she's gone off to find Donna Lucia to get her uncle's consent. We shall be in the dickens of a mess yet.

JACK Well, keep cool, man, keep cool! We're all right up to now.

(Enter LORD FANCOURT, hides. Enter SPETTIGUE)

SPETTIGUE (*strolls across stage singing, out of tune*) "Come into the garden Maud, for the black-bat night has flown. Come into the garden Maud, I am here at the gate alone"

(Exits, They pull out LORD FANCOURT)

CHARLEY You'll drag us into awful disgrace.

LORD FANCOURT You don't know the things he keeps on saying to me.

JACK He? Who?

LORD FANCOURT Why, my masher-old Spettigue.

CHARLEY Jack, I can live this lie no longer. I wish to goodness you'd bring it all to an end.

LORD FANCOURT So do I! I want a drink!

JACK We'd be all right if the donkey would only be reasonable and behave like a lady.

CHARLEY I wish we'd asked Freddy Peel now.

JACK At any rate, Freddy Peel would have stood by us like a man.

(LORD FANCOURT undoes dress)

CHARLEY We were fools to trust him.

JACK The selfish little beast!

LORD FANCOURT Here, you chaps--I won't stand this any longer, let Charley have a go.

(SPETTIGUE enters, LORD FANCOURT hides behind JACK and CHARLEY)

SPETTIGUE Mr Chesney, have you seen Donna Lucia?

CHARLEY I think she was in the garden

SPETTIGUE I have been the length and breadth of the garden

JACK But did you look among the vegetables

SPETTIGUE The vegetables?

CHARLEY Yes, she often sits among the cabbages and peas

(SPETTIGUE looks with suspicion then exits. They help LORD FANCOURT to dress)
